

Práctica: Preterite irregular Spanish 2 MCR 30 de enero, 2018

Translate VERBS ONLY to Spanish preterite. FYI nearly all are irregular.

- 1) It was last month, late at night; a friend came to my house. (ser; venir)
- 2) He <u>wanted</u> to do something, he <u>couldn't</u> sleep. (querer, poder)
- 3) He **brought** a horror movie and videogames. (**traer**)
- 4) He <u>wanted</u> to watch the movie, but I didn't <u>want</u> to watch it. (querer x2)
- 5) I <u>said</u> "I don't like scary movies" and he said "Okay." (decir, decir)
- 6) We **put** the videogame disc in the Xbox. (**poner**)
- 7) I **looked** at the television. The game **was** in Japanese. (**mirar**, **estar**)
- 8) My friend translated the menu, and changed it. (traducir, cambiar)
- 9) Meanwhile (mientras tanto), I walked to the kitchen (andar)...
- 10) ...and <u>made</u> a sandwich, because I <u>was hungry</u>. (hacer, tener hambre)
- 11) When I <u>returned</u>, my frriend <u>wasn't</u> in the room (volver, estar)
- 12) I knew it was a prank, but it gave me the chills. (saber, dar escalofrios)
- 13) He didn't <u>fit</u> under the bed... then I <u>realized</u>...(caber, saber)
- 14) He <u>was</u> in the closet! I <u>searched</u> for him ... (estar, buscar)
- 15) ..and he <u>made</u> a loud shout. He <u>wanted</u> to scare me. (hacer, querer)
- 16) ...but I <u>had</u> the advantage: I <u>knew</u> where he was, and I <u>had</u> a monster mask and a water gun. (tener, saber, tener)
