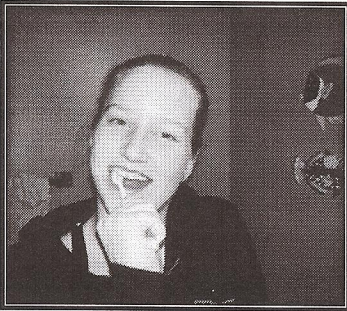


# REFLEXIVE WORKSHEET #9

Decide whether to use a reflexive or nonreflexive verb in these sentences.

1. Julia \_\_\_\_\_ (*bañar/bañarse*) al perro. (*Julia bathes the dog.*)
2. Elsa \_\_\_\_\_ (*acostar/acostarse*) el niño a las ocho. (*Elsa puts the boy to bed at 8:00.*)
3. Yo \_\_\_\_\_ (*lavar/lavarse*) los platos. (*I wash the plates.*)
4. Yo \_\_\_\_\_ (*lavar/lavarse*) las manos. (*I wash my hands.*)
5. El muchacho \_\_\_\_\_ (*afeitar/afeitarse*) con cuidado para no \_\_\_\_\_ (*cortar/cortarse*). (*The boy shaves carefully so he won't cut himself.*)
6. Vosotros \_\_\_\_\_ (*vestir/vestirse*) muy elegantemente. (*All of you dress very elegantly.*)
7. Ellas \_\_\_\_\_ (*levantar/levantarse*) temprano para ir al trabajo. (*They get up early to go to work.*)
8. Matilde \_\_\_\_\_ (*vestir/vestirse*) a su hermanita. (*Matilde dresses her little sister.*)
9. Laura \_\_\_\_\_ (*cepillar/cepillarse*) el pelo. (*Laura brushes her hair.*)

Verbos reflexivos comunes

1. acostarse (Present tense o → ue) – to lay (oneself) down
2. afeitarse – to shave (oneself)
3. apurarse – to hurry (oneself) up
4. arreglarse – to get oneself ready/organized
5. arrodillarse – to kneel down
6. bañarse – to bathe (oneself)
7. cepillarse el pelo – to brush one's hair
8. cepillarse los dientes – to brush one's teeth
9. cortarse el pelo – to have one's hair cut
10. despedirse – to say goodbye
11. despertarse (Present tense e → ie) – to wake (oneself) up
12. disculparse – to excuse (oneself) / to apologize
13. divertirse (Present tense e → ie) – to enjoy oneself (literally, to divert oneself)
14. dormirse (Present tense o → ue / Preterite o → u shoe verb) – to fall asleep
15. ducharse – to shower (oneself)
16. enfermarse – to get sick
17. enojarse – to get (oneself) angry
18. irse – to get (oneself) away, to leave, to go away
19. lavarse – to wash (oneself) up
20. lavarse [la boca/los dientes] – to "wash your mouth/teeth" i.e. cepillarse los dientes
21. levantarse – to get (oneself) up
22. maquillarse – to put makeup on oneself
23. peinarse – to comb [one's hair]
24. pintarse las uñas – to paint one's nails
25. ponerse – to put [something] on oneself
26. prepararse – to prepare (oneself), to get ready
27. quedarse – to stay, to remain, to stay put
28. quitarse – to remove [something] from oneself
29. reirse (Present tense e → i / Preterite e → i shoe verb) – to laugh
30. secarse – to dry (oneself) off
31. sentarse (Present tense e → ie) – to seat (oneself), to sit
32. sentirse (Present tense e → ie) – to feel [an emotion/illness] in oneself
33. vestirse (Present tense e → i) – to get (oneself) dressed

Remember the steps:

- ① REMOVE the "se" from the verb ending and put it in FRONT of the verb
- ② CHANGE the "se" to match the subject

- ③ CONJUGATE the verb ending normally (PRESENT/PRETERITE/IMPERFECT, etc.)
