The underlined word is the provided verb; the **bolded words** are IOPs.

1) The book pleases **me**.

To me, the book is pleasing → **gustar**

2) Does the movie annoy **you**?

To you, is the movie annoying? → **molestar**

3) **To her**, science is fascinating.

Science fascinates **her**. → **fascinar**

4) **To him**, sports are interesting.

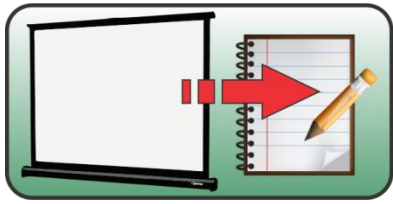
Sports interest **him**. → **interesar**

5) Spanish frustrates **us** sometimes.

To us, Spanish is frustrating sometimes. → **frustrar**

6) The music irritates **them**.

To them, the music is irritating. → **irritar**

Translate to Spanish, using Direct Object Pronouns and Indirect Object Pronouns

1. “*The homework*, do you have it?” “No, I’m looking for it.”
2. “I like *tacos*. I want to buy them.”
3. “She gives you gifts (*regalos*).”
4. “They sent us a present.” (Mandar = to send)
5. “I wrote (to you) a letter. Did you receive it?”
6. “*Kids in Africa* need **money**. I want to help them. I will send it.”
7. “That **book** – can you pass it to me?” (use “pasar”)
